It is with great enthusiasm that I am applying for your Partnership for the Future Internship Programme in Cyprus' United Nations Development Programme. Having lived two years in Athens, Greece, and one year in Istanbul, Turkey as an exchange student in Bosphorus University, I have become very familiar with both Greek and Turkish cultures, politics and ways of life. I take a keen interest in the relation between the two countries.

Sensitive to problems of social exclusion and inequalities, I want my career to have a positive impact on societies around me. Eager to develop innovative projects to address these issues, I have taken part in a prizewinning, social business plan, group project whose aim was to help refugees in Paris to get work. I have also volunteered weekly at a judiciary center for juvenile delinquents to help them become positive members of society. Interning at UNDP in Cyprus in the areas of democratic governance and civil society would allow me to support social cohesion and encourage projects on an island where the economic crisis' repercussions are still being felt.

Currently studying for a Master's degree in international Development at Sciences Po in Paris, a leading French social sciences university, I am planning to take a gap year and will be available for four months, from July to October 2016.
